And as if on cue, Serena's crying wails hit us like a death sentence.

I rush to the kitchen, but he stops me: "Forget the bandages, they won't do anything. We don't have the time. We've got to cheer her up." He hands her to me in need of a mother's love. As Serena continues to sob, her bruises widen. I kiss them, desperate to subdue my princess's curse. Just then, the sound of a car door slamming shut outside signals our doom. "Make the wounds go away! Abel pleads, but no matter how much warmth I try to make Serena feel, she wails on, deepening her abrasions. The doorbell rings. I rush Serena upstairs while Abel lets in our guest.

"Good day, Mr. Feinhart. You know the drill, I'm here to check on the baby?" // "Of course, just a minute. She's been really fussy, as you can hear, so her mother is quieting her right now." // "Oh, I should take care of that. It could be a behavior related to her self-destructive tendencies. # Adventure Is Out There!

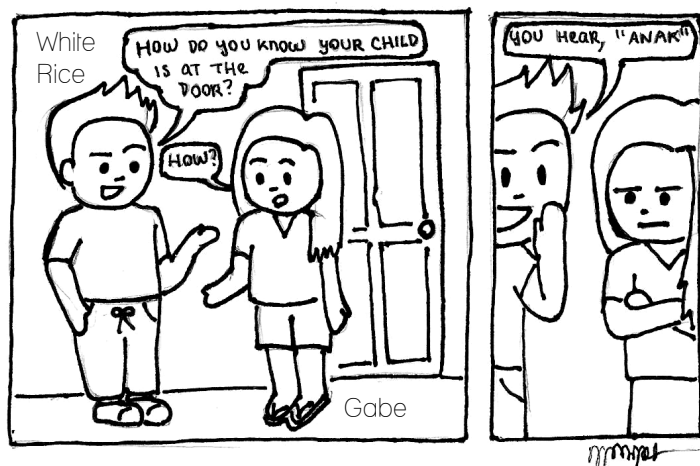
Check out what one of our members was up to this summer!
